- The Student Ministry Director is responsible for overseeing ministry to junior high and senior high students (Grades 6-12) with the guidance of the Student Ministry Team.
- The objectives are for the students to:

 - 3) Show the love of Christ by witnessing, serving and using their spiritual gifts.
- The Student Ministry Director is responsible for strategizing, planning and implementing ministry in keeping with the church mission statement.

PRINCIPAL RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Making Disciples

- Proclaim the Gospel in word and deed through student gatherings, Bible studies, retreats, etc.
- Facilitate opportunities for students to engage in outreach and missions
- Integrate students in the life of the church
- Partner with parents and guardians in the spiritual development of students
- Pastor students and families as needed
- Engage in the local community

2. Leading People

- Lead weekly student gathering, Bible studies, and retreats
- Coordinate Student Ministry-oriented retreats, mission trips, conferences and summer activities, including logistics, budgeting and financial recordkeeping
- Lead monthly Student Ministry Team (SMT) Meetings collaboratively with the elder(s) serving on team
- Plan and evaluate the Student Ministry program as a whole
- Advise the Student Ministry Team on current issues and trends in Student Ministry
- Assist the SMT in defining the vision and ministry plans for Student Ministry integrates with St. Paul's overall Vision - Missions - Values Statement
- Supervise, coach, and care for the Student Ministries Associate/Staff
- Identify, train, and lead adult volunteers and student leaders
- Assume responsibility for the safety of students and volunteers involved in SM events

3. Facilitating Programs

- Implement the ministry plans
- Develop and maintain Student Ministry budget (report expenditures monthly)
- Ensure church policy and safety measures within Student Ministries
- Coordinate with the administrative staff to maintain an accurate student database with current medical files and parental release forms
- Communicate to students, parents/guardians, and the church through social media, website, mailings, posters, and registrations
- Oversee, recruit teachers, and plan curriculum for Jr. High (6-8) and Sr. High (9-12) Sunday school classes
- Collaborate with Family and Children's ministry staff and volunteers to support parents as the primary disciplers of their children

Other Expectations

- Attend weekly worship services, church staff meetings, and retreats
- Prepare quarterly report to the session on Student Ministries
- Prepare report for annual Congregational Meeting in December
- Engage in intentional ongoing ministry development
- Assist in leading Sunday Services periodically
- Develop relationships and serve throughout the broader church family
